Awarding Body:	Innis College Council. A committee comprising the Principal of Innis College, a student representative of Innis College Council, and potentially one or two others representing the College or the Russell family (as decided by the Principal and the student representative) will adjudicate submissions and make a recommendation to the Recruitment, Admissions and Awards Committee of Innis College Council.
Conditions:	To be awarded annually to undergraduate Arts & Science students, preferably Innis College students, to reflect the work of Peter H. Russell and encourage students to seek out, as he does, the unique character of our country. The prize will be awarded to an outstanding “production” on some aspect of Canada in the form of a substantial piece of coursework (e.g., essay) or a substantial creative work (e.g., poetry, prose, drama, film, painting, or photography). (see Note 2)

1. This is a gift from Peter Russell, his family, and Innis alumni and friends. In honour of Canada’s Sesquicentennial and supported by Innis College, Peter Russell and others have launched The Russell Canada Prize. The Russell Canada Prize will be awarded annually to an undergraduate student to reflect the work of Peter H. Russell and encourage students to seek out, as he does, the unique character of our country.

Receipt of the award is not contingent on a student having passed the 5th, 10th or 15th degree credit in the Faculty of Arts and Science. The same student(s) cannot receive the award in multiple years.
